Age Categories, Race Categories and Timetable

Age Categories

The following age categories for rowers are being offered:

Junior 18 - open to those under the age of 19 on 31 August of the year of competition.

Junior 16 - open to those under the age of 17 on 31 August of the year of competition.

Junior 14 - open to those under the age of 15 on 31 August of the year of competition.

Masters 40 - open to crews where the average age is 40 years

Masters 50 - open to crews where the average age is 50 years

Composite Crews

Crews may contain members from a maximum of two clubs. Rowers must wear their own club colours. Composite crews must be declared at time of entry. Unlimited composites are however permitted in any event designated by the Offshore Committee as an international trial.

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Race Categories

The following race categories are being offered, the distance for each race is shown also.

Should heats be required they will be run over a 2Km course.

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Masters Average Crew Ages

For Masters 40 and Masters 50 crews, averaging will be used based on the age a competitor attains during the year of competition. The youngest a competitor may be is 35.

Coxes must be 18 years or over on the day of competition.

Each competitor shall be responsible for his/her own health and fitness.

The minimum combined crew ages are shown in the table below.

Separate 40's and 50's Races

If sufficient numbers of crews, from each age category, enter a 40/50 Masters Race consideration** will be given to running a separate Masters 40 and separate 50 race. Medals will be awarded in each race.

The Master 40 crews will race first at the scheduled time, followed by the Masters 50 crews, 5 minutes later.

Once final entries are known the official race timetable will be published and will include separate races as required.

^{**}It is anticipated that we will need at least 7 crews from each age category to do this.

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Combined Races

Where both 40 and 50 crews are competing in the same race a handicap system will be in place. The handicaps are shown in the table below. The 50 crews will go on the first start and the 40 crews will go on the second start at the time delay as stated below. The full race start procedure can be found in the full racing rules.

Start Procedure – The start will involve the Masters 50 crews starting once the hooter sounds and the last ball drops. After the Masters 50 crews depart one ball will be rehoisted. Once the appropriate handicap has been allowed, the single ball will drop and the hooter sounded again to indicate the start for the Masters 40 crews. Any crew crossing the start line before their ball drop will be penalised 120 seconds. The handicap to be applied for each category is listed below. As the handicaps are based on a 4000m course they will be adjusted if a shorter course is used, as in the case of heats. The Finish will be judged in the normal way. The crew finishing first will be declared the winner.
