	pontoons and slipways to the water has been risk assessed
	by design and construction and has been constructed in
	accordance with industry best practice. The temporary
	wooden slip is built to facilitate the launching of boats
	from the shore onto the water and is not more than 30
	centimetres above the water line this will be in place at
	the Round O from Friday 4th March until Saturday 5th
	March( it is to facilitate launching of boats from the
	round O onto the jetty )
Traffic	Car parking arrangements have been made at the Round
	O and Enniskillen Royal Grammar School. As per traffic
	management plan Marshals from Enniskillen Royal Boat
	Club. The Round O car park will not need to be closed off

	to Public as only a few clubs will be launching from the
	Site.
Prior Medical Condition	Clubs and their members are required to manage their
	own wellness and suitability to compete as they do in their
	own club activities on a weekly basis. Any participants
	with prior medical conditions must carry any medication
	they may need on their person or with a dedicated person
	on the bank nearby. St Johns Ambulance (first aid)
	facilities will be in location at the lakeside at the round O
	and at Enniskillen Royal Grammar School Boat Club on
	the day and the nearest local doctor is less than 2 miles
	from the event.

	• Athletes are only allowed on the water when a safety boat is present.
	• Life jackets to be worn at all times by umpires, water marshalls and coxes.
