First held in 1866, Trinity Regatta was originally raced on the Liffey in Dublin's Docklands. Since 1898, the event has been held in Islandbridge annually, excluding a brief interlude from 1915-1921 because of the First World War. The regatta is depicted in Jack Butler Yeats' well-known painting "The Islandbridge Regatta" which can be seen in the National Gallery of Ireland.

An institution of Irish rowing, Trinity Regatta is well-known for its exciting two-lane racing and vibrant social scene. In addition to lively racing, spectators can find ample entertainment on offer in the Pembroke enclosure and Regatta Bar. On completion of racing, the Competitor's Supper will be hosted in the Trinity Boathouse. Tickets for this event will be available to purchase on Eventbrite and we would encourage all participants to attend.

We look forward to welcoming all those crews from all corners of Ireland, as well as those joining us from abroad.

Rules of Racing

Trinity Regatta will be run under the rules of the Rowing Ireland.

Trinity Regatta is a non-status event as assigned by the Domestic Events Committee of Rowing Ireland. Trinity Regatta is a two-lane event, raced over a 1800m stretch along the river Liffey, through the National War Memorial Gardens in Islandbridge.

The University of Dublin, Trinity College, the Trinity Regatta Committee, Dublin University Boat Club or Dublin University Ladies Boat Club accept no liability for any injury or damage to persons or property howsoever arising during the course of the regatta or otherwise. Every competitor or his/her parent/guardian or club representative shall ensure that his/her person and equipment are properly insured before attending the regatta.

All entries must be made using the Rowing Ireland electronic entry system. No other form of entries will be accepted. Entries will close at 7pm on 7th May 2025. Late entries will not be accepted. **No competitor may enter more than two events.**

The appropriate fee must accompany entries and all cheques should be made payable to <u>DU Boat Club</u> <u>Regatta Account</u>. Crews will not be permitted to race until their entry fees have been paid.

Should the regatta or part of the regatta be cancelled, clubs will receive a 100% refund in respect of fees paid for races cancelled for which they have paid entry fees.

The Regatta Committee reserves the right to make any alterations it deems necessary to the programme of events and its decision shall be final. In order to restrict the length of the racing programme, the Regatta Committee reserves the right to limit some events in which four or fewer crews are entered.

In the event of a particularly large entry, heats for some events may commence on Friday evening (12th May). Consideration will be made for travelling clubs so that only local clubs will be asked to race on Friday. In the event of a large entry of single sculls, a 1000m time trial may be held on Saturday morning in lieu of heats.

The regatta committee will endeavour to run heats and finals for Junior 15 and Junior 14 events. However, in the event of a large entry, Junior 15 and Junior 14 events may be run as straight finals.

Junior 14 and Master's races will be raced over 1000m. Junior 14 Races will begin with a flying start at the concrete wall and finish at the main regatta finish. Master's Races will begin at the stakeboats and finish along the main straight, marked across the river from the Army Rowing Club slip. Junior 15 races will be raced over 1500m. These races will begin at the stakeboats at the normal regatta start and finish at the 1500m finish, marked at Neptune Rowing Club.

Crews must obey the directions of umpires and regatta officials at all times. Crews who do not obey the directions of regatta officials will be subject to a false start or direct disqualification. Training is not permitted on the river 30 minutes prior to the start of the regatta.

Boats launching will be checked by slip stewards. Every boat must have a securely fixed bow ball which fully covers the bow of the boat. Heel restraints must be properly fitted. All coxswains must wear life jackets. These points will be enforced strictly on the day.

It is the responsibility of each participating club committee to ensure the safety of their members while participating. It is the intention of the Trinity Regatta committee to implement its own policy and to provide an example to participating clubs by creating a positive safety environment during the event.

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Events

The Trinity Regatta Committee reserves the right to make any alterations it deems necessary to the programme of events and its decision shall be final. In order to restrict the length of the racing programme, the Regatta Committee reserves the right to limit some events in which four or fewer crews are entered.

In the event of a particularly large entry, heats for some events may commence on Friday evening (16th May). Consideration will be made for travelling clubs so that only local clubs will be asked to race on Friday.

In the event of a large entry of single sculls, a 1000m time trial may be held on Saturday morning in lieu of heats. Any clubs involved will be notified if this is deemed necessary.

No competitor may enter more than two events.

The winners of every event will receive Trinity Regatta medals.
